

... bring together health and social care leaders, professionals and patient representatives to provide independent clinical advice. We provide a clinical perspective that is independent to the services and structures under review, using the knowledge and expertise of clinicians, professional and patient representatives, from across health and social care, who are able to understand the potential impact of proposals across our East of England geography.



What we do... Range and Scope of Work



Independent Clinical Review Panels

- Early ideas through to stage II assurance
- Single small volume service covering wide geographical area (e.g. Paediatric Rheumatology)
- Single service change but with significant patient, public and political interest (e.g. PET CT relocation)
- Whole system transformation (STP plans etc)


Proactive projects

Clinical Senate's Perspective



- Evidence based
- Big picture

- Aware of finances but not our focus

Independent



- Reports not directed, edited or vetted by NHS England opinions of carefully selected panels.
- Commissioners of work can challenge matters of accuracy but not expert review or opinion.
- Panel members do not represent their employing organisation or professional body.
- Conflicts of interest carefully managed.

Proactive work



- Commissioned or self determined
- Constrained by capacity
- 7-day services (with Public Health England)
